SECOND SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST

Troparion (1):

Though the stone was sealed by the Jews and soldiers guarded Your immaculate body, You arose, O Savior, on the third day, and gave life to the world. And so the heavenly powers cried out to You, O Giver of life: Glory to Your resurrection, O Christ! Glory to Your kingdom! Glory to Your saving plan, O only Lover of Mankind!

Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit, now and forever and ever amen.

Kontakion (1): You arose in glory from the tomb and with Yourself You raised the world. All humanity acclaims You as God, and death has vanished. Adam exults, O Master; and Eve, redeemed now from bondage, cries out for joy: You are the One, O Christ, Who offer resurrection to all.

Prokimenon (1):

Let Your mercy, O Lord, be upon us, as we have hoped in You.

Verse: Rejoice in the Lord, O you just; praise befits the righteous.

Epistle: Reading of the Epistle of St. Paul to the Romans (Rom 2,10-16)

Brethren: There will be glory, honor, and peace for everyone who does good, Jew first and then Greek. There is no partiality with God. All who sin outside the law will also perish without reference to it, and all who sin under the law will be judged in accordance with it. For it is not those who hear the law who are just in the sight of God; rather, those who observe the law will be justified. For when the Gentiles who do not have the law by nature observe the prescriptions of the law, they are a law for themselves even though they do not have the law. They show that the demands of the law are written in their hearts, while their conscience also bears witness and their conflicting thoughts accuse or even defend them on the day when, according to my gospel, God will judge people's hidden works through Christ Jesus.

Alleluia Verses:

Verse : God gives me vindication, and has subdued peoples under me. Alleluia, Alleluia,

Verse : Making great the salvation of the king, and showing mercy to His anointed, to David, and to his posterity for ever. Alleluia, Alleluia, Alleluia.

Gospel: (Mt 4,18-23) At that time, as Jesus was walking by the Sea of Galilee, he saw two brothers, Simon who is called Peter, and his brother Andrew, casting a net into the sea; they were fishermen. He said to them, "Come after me, and I will make you fishers of men." At once they left their nets and followed him. He walked along from there and saw two other brothers, James, the son of Zebedee, and his brother John. They were in a boat, with the father Zebedee, mending their nets. He called them and immediately they left their boat and their father and followed him. He went around all of Galilee, teaching in their synagogues, proclaiming the gospel of the kingdom, and curing every disease and illness among the people.

"Lord, what lesson have you taught me about fatherhood?"

Our Lord teaches us about how to live as children of the Father. Those men who are called to be dads themselves, work and love hard to insure their children have a good life and even a better life than they do. We honor those men today who have accepted the vocation of being a Father.

Although sometimes at funerals of older men, I have learned that one or more of the adult children are carrying grievances against the deceased for something he did ages ago or should have done and failed. In such times, "Forgive your father,"

"He's human. He made mistakes, yes. But who among us has not sinned? And we will want our children to forgive us. "On the cross, the Lord Jesus looked at His executioners surrounding Him. *"Father, forgive them," He prayed. "They know not what they do"* (Luke 23:34). In this case, we say, "Forgive your father. He may or may not have known what he was doing. Forgive him anyway.

Reflections for Father's on Father's Day;

- **Who I am.** The man who does not know who he is will be forever trying to find out and to prove himself a man in unhealthy ways.
- **Whose I am.** Is he accountable to any one? Or is he on his own in this world? The man who knows he is a creation of Almighty God and the redeemed of a loving Savior is likely to live a different kind of life from one who doesn't.
- **What am I here for?** He needs to know what his role is in life? Why was he put here on earth? Is it to find himself, express himself, fulfill himself, or is he here for a higher, nobler purpose?
- **Where I'm going.** I love the testimony of beleaguered Job. In the midst of his pain and suffering, in the darkness of his soul's depression, still his faith was intact. He called out, *"I know that my Redeemer lives, and He shall stand at last on the earth; and after my skin is destroyed, this I know, that in my flesh I shall see God, whom I shall see for myself, and my eyes shall behold and not another"* (Job 19:25-27).

In the last writing we have from his hand, the Apostle Paul testified, *"I know whom I have believed and am persuaded that He is able to keep what I have committed to Him against that day"* (II Timothy 1:12).

The Apostle John put it this way: *"By this we know that we know Him, if we keep His commandments"* (I John 2:3). We know that we know.

What do you know? And what difference has it made in your life?

SOME THOUGHTS FROM THE MISSION STATEMENT OF POPE FRANCIS

The document, *Evangelii Gaudium*, (The Joy of the Gospel), is the second major teaching document issued by Francis. Pope Francis' concerns are laced throughout, and the theological and historical citations leave no doubt about his own points of reference and priorities: Popes John XXIII and Paul VI, who presided over the Second Vatican Council, which brought the church into the modern world, are cited repeatedly. In the text, Francis denounced trickle-down economic theories as unproven and naïve, saying they are based on a survival of the fittest mentality "where the powerful feed upon the powerless" with no regard for ethics, the environment or even God.

"Money must serve, not rule!" he said in calling for political leaders to reform the system. "The Pope loves everyone, rich and poor alike, but he is obliged in the name of Christ to remind all that the rich must help, respect and promote the poor."

In a direct challenge to the focus of the past two popes, he also decried the church's "obsession" with rules and doctrine and said in some cases, the church's old customs can be cast aside if they no longer serve to communicate the faith. In the church's "hierarchy of truths," mercy is paramount, proportion is necessary, and what counts is inviting the faithful in, he said.

At the same time, Francis restated the church's opposition to abortion, making clear that the doctrine is non-negotiable and is at the core of the church's insistence on the dignity of every human being.

The aim of the text was to set out his idea of what the Catholic Church should be, and how its priests, bishops and even the pope must change course to fulfill the task.

"I prefer a church which is bruised, hurting and dirty because it has been out on the streets, rather than a church which is unhealthy from being confined and from clinging to its own security," he wrote. "I do not want a church concerned with being at the center and then ends up by being caught up in a web of obsessions and procedures."

He added: "More than by fear of going astray, my hope is that we will be moved by the fear of remaining shut up within structures which give us a false sense of security, within rules which make us harsh judges, within habits which make us feel safe, while at our door people are starving and Jesus does not tire of saying to us, 'Give them something to eat.'"

In the frank and often funny style that has come to define Francis' preaching, the Argentine Jesuit chastised priests for their complacency, giving them a lesson on preparing homilies that don't put the faithful to sleep. He reminded them that confession shouldn't be "torture," and told them to get out of their sacristies, get their shoes muddy, get involved in the lives of their faithful and not be defeatist "sourpusses."

Francis is currently overseeing a major overhaul in order to make the papacy reflect better what Jesus intended and what the church needs today. "Excessive centralization, rather than proving helpful, complicates the church's life and her missionary outreach," he said.

Called to be Disciples

Taking Peter with him, Andrew brought his brother to the Lord, thus making him his fellow-disciple. This was Andrew's first achievement: he increased the number of the apostles by bringing Peter to Christ, so that Christ might find in him the disciples' leader. When later on Peter won approval, it was thanks to the seed sown by Andrew. But the commendation given to the one rebounded to the other, for the virtues of each belonged to both, and each was proud of the other's merits. Indeed, when Peter promptly answered the master's question, how much joy he gave to all the disciples by breaking their embarrassed silence! Peter alone acted as the mouthpiece of those to whom the question was addressed. As though all spoke through him, he replied clearly on their behalf: You are the Christ, the Son of the

living God. In one sentence he acknowledged both the Savior and his saving plan.

Notice how these words echo Andrew's. By prompting Peter the Father endorsed from above the words Andrew used when he led Peter to Christ. Andrew had said: We have found the Messiah. The Father said, prompting Peter: You are the Christ, the Son of the living God, almost forcing these words on Peter. "Peter," he said, "when you are questioned, use Andrew's words in reply. Show yourself very prompt in answering your master. Andrew did not lie to you when he said: We have found the Messiah. Turn the Hebrew words into Greek and cry out: You are the Christ, the Son of the living God!"
