

We will be making pyrohy again this Tuesday and Wednesday in the church hall. Tuesday from 9:00AM-6:00PM and Wednesday from 9:00AM till finish. Please join with us if you can. INTERIOR PAINTING OF THE CHURCH APPROVED

We have received approval from the Archbishop to proceed with the renovations and painting of the interior of Holy Ghost Church. It has been over 30 years since the interior has been painted. We have contracted Gordon Bennett Company of Easton to do the repairing of the cracks in the ceiling and walls, repair the plaster damaged from the leaks in the tower, and paint the interior of the church. The estimate for the repair and painting is \$25, 465.00.

We have also been in consultation with Christina Dochwat an renowned iconographer and artist who has worked on over 80 churches in her career to assist us in color choices and stenciling.

During the project we will be having services in the chapel across the street using the same weekly schedule. The project is expected to run between 2-3 weeks. Your building fund donations, your support of our pyrohy projects etc, and your weekly donations help us to meet our financial obligations and to maintain the integrity and beauty of our church for generations to come. Thank you for your continued support.

Once the insurances, artist and preparations have been accomplished we will be able to give you the definite starting time for this project. We pray for all involved.

SUNDAY OF MEATFARE POSTFEAST OF THE PRESENTATION OF OUR LORD IN THE TEMPLE Troparion (2):

When You went down to death, O Life Immortal, You struck Hades dead with the blazing light of Your divinity. When You raised the dead from the nether world, all the powers of heaven cried out: O Giver of life, Christ our God, glory be to You! Troparion (1):Hail, Mother of God, Virgin full of grace. From you has shown forth the Son of Justice, Christ our God, shining upon those who are in darkness. Rejoice also, you just Elder, Simeon; for you received in your arms the Redeemer of our souls, Who has given us Resurrection.

Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit. Now and for ever and ever: Amen.

Kontakion (1):When You will come to earth in glory, O God, and all creatures will tremble before You, the river of fire will flow before Your judgment seat, and the books will be opened and all hidden things revealed; deliver me from the unquenchable fire and make me worthy to stand at Your right hand, O righteous Judge.

Prokimenon (3):

Great is our Lord and mighty in strength, and His wisdom is without measure. Verse:Praise the Lord for He is good. Sing to our Godfor He is loving; to Him our praise is due.

Epistle:Reading of the First Epistle of St. Paul to the Corinthians.(1Cor 8,8-13;9,1-2) Brethren: Now food will not bring us closer to God. We are no worse off if we do not eat, nor are we better off if we do. But make sure that this liberty of yours in no way becomes a stumbling block to the weak. If someone sees you, with your knowledge, reclining at table in the temple of an idol, may not his conscience too, weak as it is, be "built up" to eat the meat sacrificed to idols? Thus, through your knowledge, the weak person is brought to destruction, the brother for whom Christ died. When you sin in this way against your brothers and wound their consciences, weak as they are, you are sinning against Christ. Therefore, if food causes my brother to sin, I will never eat meat again, so that

I may not cause my brother to sin. Am I not free? Am I not an apostle? Have I not seen Jesus our Lord? Are you not my work in the Lord? Although I may not be an apostle for others, certainly I am for you, for you are the seal of my apostleship in the Lord.

Alleluia Verses:

Verse:Come, ring out your joy to the Lord; hail God Who is our Savior. Verse:Let us come before Him, giving thanks; with songs let us hail the Lord.

Gospel:(Mt 25,31-46)

The Lord said, When the Son of Man comes in his glory, and all the angels with him, he willsit upon his glorious throne, and all the nations will be assembled before him. And he will separate them one from another, as a shepherd separates the sheep from the goats. He will place the sheep on his right and the goats on his left. Then the king will say to those on his right. 'Come, you who are blessed by my Father. Inherit the kingdom prepared for you from the foundation of the world. For I was hungry and you gave me food, I was thirsty and you gave me drink, a stranger and you welcomed me, naked and you clothed me, ill and you cared for me, in prison and you visited me.' Then then the righteous will answer him and say, 'Lord, when did we see you hungry and feed you, or thirsty and give you drink? When did we see you a stranger and welcome you, or naked and clothe you? When did we see you ill or in prison, and visit you?' And the king will say to them in reply, 'Amen, I say to you, whatever you did for one of these least brothers of mine, you did for me. Then he will say to those on his left, 'Depart from me, you accursed, into the eternal fire prepared for the devil and his angels. For I was hungry and you gave me no food, I was thirsty and you gave me no drink, a stranger and you gave me no welcome, naked and you gave me no clothing, ill and in prison, and you did not care for me.' Then they will answer and say, 'Lord, when did we see you hungry or thirsty or a stranger or naked or ill or in prison, and not minister to your needs?' He will answer them, 'Amen, I say to you, what you did not do for one of these least ones, you did not do for me.' And these will go off to eternal punishment, but the righteous into eternal life.

O Virgin Mother of God, hope of Christians, protect, watch, and save those who have placed their hope in you. We, the faithful, see the figure of Christ in the shadow and the letter of the law which says: Every male who opens the womb shall be called holy to the Lord.
