

Духовні правила на Великий Піст

Хоч наппа Церква традиційно приписує утримання від споживання м'яса і молочних страв у всі дні Великого Посту, подаємо мінімальні Великопосні правила на сьогодні:

Утримання від вживання м'яса та молочних страв в перший день Великого Посту, та в Страсну П'ятницю.

Утримання від вживання м'яса у всі п'ятниці Великого Посту як і на Страсну Суботу. Традиційно утримуються від вживання м'яса ще й по середах Великого Посту.

Таїнство сповіді з Пресвятою Євхаристією приймається в період від початку Великого Посту до середи перед святом Вознесіння Господнього.

Піст та правила утримання не зобов'язують людей старше 60-ти років, дуже немічних, жінок-годувальниць і вагітних, дітей до 14 років і тих, хто важко працює фізично. Однак, всіх закликається, якщо це можливо, дотримуватися посту і обмежуючих правил.

Усіх вірних закликається брати участь у Великопосні богослуження, такі як Літургія Напередосвячених Дарів, та Сорокоусти.

Такі добрі діла, як творити милостиню, відвідання хворих, Біблійні читання та молитися за покликання до священства та релігійного життя, щиро рекомендуються заохочуємо всіх вірних до активної участі.

Літургійні вказівки Великого Посту

Будні Великого посту є нелітургійними, тобто, Служба Божа не правиться навіть на похороні за виключенням празника Благовіщення. У середи та п'ятниці Великого Посту відправляється Літургія Напередосвячених Дарів. Другі дні можна відправляти Типик. На похоронах можна користуватися літургійним текстом, який вживається в Ню-Джерзійському деканаті та в церкві св. Михаїла в Фраквілл, ПА. Впродовж цього часу в неділі відправляється Літургія св. Василія Великого.

Під час Страсного Тижня Літургія Напередосвячених Дарів відправляється в понеділок, вівторок та середу. У Страспу п'ятницю та суботу Божественна Літургія не відправляється. Ввечері Страсного Четверга відправляється Вечірня з Божественною Літургією св. Василія Великого а ввечері Страспої Суботи — Вечірня з Божественною Літургією св. Василія Великого.

The Lord told this parable, "A man had two sons, and the younger son said to his father, 'Father, give me the share of your estate that should come to me.' So the father divided the property between them. After a few days, the younger son collected all his belongings and set off to a distant country where he squandered his inheritance on a life of dissipation. When he had freely spent everything, a severe famine struck that country, and he found himself in dire need. So he hired himself out to one of the local citizens who sent him to his farm to tend the swine. And he longed to eat his fill of the pods on which the swine fed, but nobody gave him any. Coming to his senses he thought, 'How many of my father's hired workers have more than enough food to eat, but here am I, dying from hunger. I shall get up and go to my father and I shall say to him, 'Father, I have sinned against heaven and against you. I no longer deserve to be called your son; treat me as you would treat one of your hired workers.' So he got up and went back to his father. While he was still a long way off, his father caught sight of him, and was filled with compassion. He ran to his son, embraced him and kissed him. His son said to him, 'Father, I have sinned against heaven and against you; I no longer deserve to be called your son.' But his father ordered his servants, 'Quickly bring the finest robe and put it on him; put a ring on his finger and sandals on his feet. Take the fattened calf and slaughter it. Then let us celebrate with a feast, because this son of mine was dead, and has come to life again; he was lost, and has been found.' Then the celebration began. Now the older son had been out in the field and, on his way back, as he neared the house, he heard the sound of music and dancing. He called one of the servants and asked what this might mean. The servant said to him, 'Your brother has returned and your father has slaughtered the fattened calf because he has him back safe and sound.' He became angry, and when he refused to enter the house, his father came out and pleaded with him. He said to his father in reply, 'Look, all of these years I served you and not once did I disobey your orders; yet you never gave me even a young goat to feast on with my friends. But when your son returns who swallowed up your property with prostitutes, for him you slaughter the fattened calf.' He said to him, 'My son, you are here with me always; everything I have is yours. But now we must celebrate and rejoice, because your brother was dead and has come back to life again; he was lost and has been found.""

Spiritual Regulations for the Great Fast

Although our Church traditionally prescribed abstention from meat and dairy products in days gone by for the entire duration of the Great Fast, the following are the minimal Lenten regulations today:

Abstinence from meat and all dairy products on the First Day of the Great Fast and on Good Friday.

Abstinence from meat only on all Fridays of the Great Fast as well as Holy Saturday. It is also traditional to abstain from meat on Wednesdays during the Great Fast.

Reception of the Holy Mysteries of Reconciliation and Holy Eucharist during the period from the onset of Great Fast to the Wednesday before Ascension Thursday.

The Fasting and Abstinence regulations are not binding on persons 60 or older, the very poor, sick, nursing or pregnant women, children below the age of 14, and those who engage in physically very hard labor. However, all are urged, if able to do so, to observe the fasting and abstinence regulations.

All the faithful are urged to attend the Lenten services such as the Presanctified Liturgy and the Commemoration of the Deceased (Sorokousty).

Such good deeds as almsgiving, visitation of the sick, Bible reading and praying for vocations to the priesthood and religious life are most earnestly recommended to all the Faithful.

Great Fast Liturgical Guidelines

The weekdays of the Great Fast are aliturgical meaning no Divine Liturgy, even for funerals, should be celebrated except for the Feast of the Annunciation. On Wednesdays and Fridays of the Great Fast, the Liturgy of the Presanctified Gifts is to be celebrated. Typika may be used the other days. For funerals, the liturgical text used by the New Jersey Protopresbyterate or St. Michael Church in Frackville may be utilized. The Divine Liturgy of St. Basil the Great is to be celebrated for Sunday Liturgies during this time.

During Holy Week, the Liturgy of the Presanctified Gifts is to be celebrated Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday. There is no Divine Liturgy celebrated on Good Friday and Holy Saturday. On Holy Thursday evening, Vespers with Divine Liturgy of St. Basil the Great should be celebrated. On Holy Saturday evening, Vespers with the Divine Liturgy of St. Basil the Great is to be celebrated.

The Return of the Prodigal Son

"He arose and went to his father." He arose from the wreckage of his conscience and body alike. He arose from the depths of hell and touched the heights of heaven. Before the heavenly Father, a child rises higher because of pardon than he fell low because of guilt.

"He arose and went to his father." He went not by the motion of his feet but by the progress of his thought. Being afar off he had no need of an earthly journey, because he had found short cuts along the way of salvation. He who seeks the divine Father by faith soon finds Him present to himself, and has no need to seek Him by traversing roads.

"He arose and went to his father. But when he was yet a long way off." How is he who is coming a long way off? Because he has not yet arrived. He who is coming is coming to do penance, but he has not yet arrived at grace. He is coming to his Father's house but he has not yet reached the glory of his former condition, appearance, and honor.

"But when he was yet a long way off, his father saw him." That Father saw, he "who dwells on high; and looks down on the low things," "and the high he knows afar off." "His father saw him." The father saw him, in such a way that the son could also behold his father. The father's countenance illumined the face of the approaching son in such a way that all the dark aspect was dispelled which his guilt had previously cast about it.
